Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Opinion

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ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

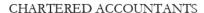
Management's Responsibilities for the Standalone Financial Results
